EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The 2010/2011 General Election was the second to be held under a Multi-Party political dispensation since 1980. The Commission held elections on 18th February 2011, 23rd February 2011, 2nd March 2011 and 7th March 2011 for Presidential and Parliamentary, District/City Local Government Council, Municipal/City Division Local Government Council and Sub county Local Government Council levels respectively.

In 2007, the Electoral Commission started planning for the general elections by drawing the 2007-2011 Strategic Plan and a Roadmap, with a project proposal that phased the financing over a period of three (3) financial years. Voter Education was integrated into the school curriculum for primary and secondary. The National Voters' Register was hosted on the Electoral Commission website and could be easily accessed by interested voters to obtain their personal details by just sending short messages on mobile phones.

The effort resulted into an elected President (1), an elected Parliament (375 MPs), elected 112 District/City Chairpersons and their Councillors (2,817), elected 27 Municipality/City Division Chairpersons and their Councillors (3,586), elected 1,327 Sub-county/Town/Municipal Division Chairpersons and their Councillors (20,524) and filled all (595,710) Youth Council/Committees countrywide.

The Government of the Republic of Uganda funded the 2010/2011 General Elections to the tune of Ug. Shs. 280,115,678,848/= that was released in phases, over a period of three (3) financial years. The donor community provided an additional sum of Ug. Shs. 5,313,225,650/= towards various electoral activities - voter education and training, online access to the National Voters' Register and the Electronic Results Transmission and Dissemination Systems. Additional in-kind support was received from the donor community that included computers, scanners, printers, ballot boxes and solar lamps for lighting at polling stations.

In order to enhance the delivery of electoral services to the public, the Commission reorganized polling stations from 19,786 to 23,968, recruited, trained and deployed its own

Sub-county and Parish supervisors and trained and sensitized the voters and stakeholders at all stages of the electoral process. The Commission replaced the digital cameras with the Biometric system which integrated a Finger Print Reader, Signature Scanner and captured more information from eligible voters. A total of 4,624,602 newly captured voter data was integrated into the 10.5 Million old data that was processed into the polling register. The Parish tribunals, appointed by the Judicial Officers at the district level, confirmed the correctness of the recommended changes in the National Voters' Register (NVR) during the display. A total of 13.9 million registered voters remained on the National Voters' Register (NVR).

During the period under review fourteen (14) new counties and nine (09) municipalities were created. These became new parliamentary constituencies. The Commission nominated (8) eight candidates out of (58) aspirants who picked nomination forms for Presidential elections on 25th and 26th October 2010; (36,824) for Local Government Councils elections from 27th October to 9th November 2010; and (1,708) Parliamentary nominations on 25th and 26th November 2010.

The Political Parties/Organisations which sponsored Presidential candidates were the Peoples' Development Party (PDP), Forum for Democratic Change (FDC), Uganda Federal Alliance (UFA), People's Progressive Party (PPP), Democratic Party (DP), Uganda Peoples' Congress (UPC) and National Resistance Movement (NRM). The distribution of sponsorship for all elective posts were as follows: CP (0.12%), DP(4.22%), FDC(16.82%), FIL(0.01%), FPU (0.00003%), GPP(0.01%), JEEMA(0.16%), LDT(0.10%), MVMO(0.0026%), NRM(47.52%), NURP(0.00003%), PDP(0.09%), PPD(0.01%), PPP(0.38%), SDP(0.38%), UEP(0.01%), UFA(0.39%), UPC (5.34%) and INDEPENDENTS(24.43734%).

The Political Parties/Organizations and Candidates agents/representatives and key stakeholders coordinated with the Commission, monitored and observed the entire electoral process. The Uganda Police Force put in place an Electoral Crime Investigation Unit that expeditiously handled election related crimes, nationwide. This initiative was timely and commendable.

On each of the polling days during the General Elections 2010/2011, most of the candidates' agents had a copy of the voters' register at each polling station which made the polling

process fast and transparent. Each polling station was managed by a Presiding Officer, four Polling Assistants and one Polling Constable. An Orderly Officer was stationed to ensure order at the polling centres.

In order to ease the transmission, tallying, verification, ascertaining and declaration of results of the elections and to enable all the stakeholders access the results immediately after verification; the Commission installed an Election Results Transmission and Dissemination System (ERTDS). A National Results Tally Centre was set up at the National Stadium Namboole, Kampala for the tallying of the Presidential election results.

The Presidential Election Results were as follows:-

Yoweri Kaguta Museveni (NRM) obtained 68.38%, Besigye Kizza (FDC): 26.01%, Mao Norbert (DP): 1.86%, Abed Bwanika (PDP): 0.65%, Olara Otunnu (UPC) 1.58%, Beti Olive Kamyamba Namisango (UFA): 0.66%, Bidandi-Ssali Jaberu (PPP): 0.44% and Samuel Lubega Mukaaku Walter (Independent): 0.41% of total votes cast.

Accordingly, candidate Yoweri Kaguta Museveni (NRM) was declared the elected President of the Republic of Uganda on Saturday 20th February, 2011. He was sworn in on 12th May, 2011 at Kololo Airstrip.

The Electoral Commission is satisfied that it fulfilled its mandate to organise, conduct and supervise free and fair 2010/2011 General Elections despite some constraints.

The Commission will build on its achievements and strive to overcome the shortcomings identified during the electoral process.

CHAPTER ONE

INTRODUCTION AND LEGAL FRAMEWORK

1.1 ESTABLISHMENT AND MANDATE OF THE ELECTORAL COMMISSION

The Electoral Commission is established under Article 60 and mandated under Article 61 of the Constitution of the Republic of Uganda 1995 (as Amended), to organize, conduct and supervise regular, free and fair elections and referenda, among other functions. In order to fulfill its mandate, the Electoral Commission is guided by its mission and vision.

The Commission's mission is to **organize and conduct regular, free and fair elections and referenda professionally, impartially and efficiently;** while its vision is to be a **model institution and centre of excellence in Election Management.**

1.2 ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE OF THE ELECTORAL COMMISSION

The current Electoral Commission is composed of: the Chairperson, Eng. Dr. Badru M. Kiggundu, the Deputy Chairperson, Mr. Biribonwa N. Joseph and five members, namely; Dr. Okello B. Jenny, Mr. Buruku W. Tom, Mr. Ongaria D. Steven, Dr. Kiryapawo Tomasi Sisye and Mrs. Mugabi Justine Ahabwe. **(See Plate 1 for details).**

The Commission has a Secretariat headed by the Secretary, Mr. Sam A. Rwakoojo who is assisted by three Directors - Mrs Jovita Byamugisha (Finance and Administration), Mr. Leonard Mulekwah (Director of Operations) and Mr. Pontius Namugera (Technical Support Service). Under the Directorate of Operations, there are four (04) Departments - Voter Data Management, Field Operations, Election Management and Voter Education and Training. The Directorate of Finance and Administration is composed of the Departments of Finance, Human Resources and Administration; while the Directorate of Technical Support Services is made up of Departments of Information Technology and Planning and Research. The Legal Department, Public Relations Unit, Internal Audit Unit and the Procurement Unit report directly to the Secretary of the Electoral Commission.

1.3 ELECTIVE POSITIONS

This report covers the election of the President, Members of Parliament and the Local Government Councils and Youth Councils/Committees.

1.3.1 The Presidency

The President heads the Executive Arm of Government and is elected by universal adult suffrage through secret ballot. The President is the fountain of honour of the nation and in order for his/her election to be conclusive; the winning candidate has to obtain an absolute majority of the total number of valid votes cast during the election. This means winning 50% plus one vote as provided for in Article 103(4) of the 1995 Constitution of the Republic of Uganda (as Amended).

According to Article 61(2) of the Constitution, the Electoral Commission is mandated to hold Presidential, general Parliamentary and Local Government Council Elections within the first thirty (30) days of the last ninety (90) days before the expiration of the term of the President.

This period was running from 12th February, 2011 to 13th March, 2011. The President was accordingly elected on the 18th February, 2011.

1.3.2 The National Parliament

Subject to Article 63 (1) and (2) of the Constitution of Uganda, every constituency as approved by Parliament must have at least one Member of Parliament; except that no constituency should fall within more than one county.

The Electoral Commission organised elections for members of the 9th Parliament as follows - two hundred thirty eight (238) Directly Elected Members representing Constituencies, one hundred twelve (112) District Woman Representatives and twenty five (25) Representatives of Special Interest Groups (SIG's) distributed as follows: ten (10) for the Uganda Peoples' Defence Forces (UPDF), five (05) for the Workers, five (05) for the Youth and five (05) for Persons with Disabilities (PWDs).

1.3.3 The Local Government Councils

The Local Government Councils include the following - one hundred twelve (112) Districts, twenty seven (27) Municipalities/City Divisions and one thousand three hundred twenty seven (1,327) Sub-Counties/Municipality Divisions. These elective positions were duly filled within the constitutional deadline.

1.3.3.1 The Youth Councils/Committees and Representatives of Persons with Disabilities (PWDs)

The Councilors representing the Youth and Persons with Disabilities to various local government councils were elected by their respective electoral colleges comprising elected leaders from the grassroots through secret ballot. The 2010/2011, General Elections were accomplished in conformity with this pattern. The levels/categories and mode of election during the 2010/2011 General Elections are shown in **Appendix I**.

1.4 DEMARCATION OF PARLIAMENTARY CONSTITUENCIES AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT ELECTORAL AREAS

Demarcation of electoral boundaries for representation in Parliament and Local Government Councils is provided for in the Constitution (1995), the Parliamentary Elections Act, 2005 (as Amended) and the Local Governments Act, Cap 243 (as Amended). Demarcation of boundaries for the respective Electoral Areas was done in accordance with the provisions of the law.

1.5 LEGAL FRAMEWORK

The conduct of free and fair elections calls for a comprehensive legal framework consistent with the holding of such elections. The Legal Framework within which the 2010/2011 General Elections were conducted consisted of the following:-

1.5.1 The Constitution of the Republic of Uganda, 1995 (as Amended).

The Constitution provides for the composition, mandate, functions of the Commission in the electoral process and timeline within which to conduct the elections.

1.5.2 The Electoral Commission Act, Cap 140 (as Amended).

This is an Act of Parliament that makes provisions relating to the staffing, powers and functions of the Commission, appointment of tribunals, display process and other election-related matters.

1.5.3 The Presidential Elections Act, 2005 (as Amended).

This Act provides for election of the President. It also spells out the requirements for qualifications, nomination of candidates, sponsorship of candidates by political parties and organisations, facilitation of candidates, campaign period, polling procedure, counting, tallying and declaration of results, as well as handling of petitions, among others.

1.5.4 The Parliamentary Elections Act, 2005 (as Amended).

The Parliamentary Elections Act, 2005 provides for the mode of elections, requirements for qualifications, nomination of candidates, sponsorship of candidates by political parties and organisations, campaign period, polling procedure, counting, tallying and declaration of results as well as handling of petitions, among others.

1.5.5 The Local Governments Act, Cap 243 (as Amended).

The Local Governments Act provides for the establishment of Local Governments, their functions and powers, mode of election to the various local government councils, demarcations of electoral areas, qualification requirements, nomination requirements, sponsorship of candidates by political parties and organisations, campaigns, polling procedures, counting, tallying and declaration of results as well as handling of petitions, among others.

1.5.6 The Political Parties and Organizations Act, 2005 (as Amended).

The Political Parties and Organizations Act makes provision for the financing and functioning of Political Parties and Organizations, their formation, registration, membership and organization under Articles 71, 72, and 73 of the Constitution; the prescription of their code of conduct (Section 19) and the establishment of the National Consultative Forum (Section 20).

1.5.7 National Youth Council Act (as Amended) and Regulations.

The Act provides for the establishment of the National Youth Council, its composition, objectives and functions, administration and finances, nominations, qualifications, campaigns and polling procedures.

CHAPTER TWO

PLANNING FOR THE 2011 GENERAL ELECTIONS

2.1 INTRODUCTION

The Electoral Commission drew a five year strategic plan beginning January, 2007 and ending December, 2011 to facilitate the execution of its mandate and indicate the state of readiness for the 2010/2011 General Elections. The strategic plan was used as a tool for systematic planning; performance management; defining strategic action areas and programmes; and building block for the next strategic plan.

The Commission also drew lessons from a number of court judgments which highlighted critical areas for attention and improvement in service delivery. Many evaluation measures for improvements were documented.

2.2 THE COMMISSION'S STRATEGIC OBJECTIVES

The Electoral Commission strategic objectives for this period were;

- a.** Educate and sensitize Ugandans of six (6) years and above on elections and referenda for effective participation in all electoral processes;
- b.** Optimise resource utilization in the conduct of elections and referenda through streamlined processes;
- c.** Develop an integrated information management system for efficiency and effectiveness;
- d.** Improve the credibility of the National Voters' Register;
- e.** Build, equip and develop an efficient and well motivated workforce;
- f.** Enhance public confidence in the Electoral Commission as a credible institution in charge of elections; and
- g.** Improve the Commission's operations through Research and Development.

The Strategic plan detailed specific tasks to be performed with clear timelines, inputs/resources, outputs, performance indicators, assumptions and responsibility centres for their implementation. This formed the basis for developing the 2010/2011 General Elections Roadmap.

2.3 REFORMS DEvised FOR 2011 GENERAL ELECTIONS

The Electoral Commission introduced reforms that were tested through a number of by-elections conducted since 2007 in order to improve management of the elections.

Further more, other measures were adopted which included, the holding of consultative meetings, seminars, workshops with stakeholders' (political parties/organizations and candidates or their agents), establishment of a National Information Desk and District Complaints Desks, training of Party/Organization/Candidates' Agents and phased implementation and funding of electoral activities, in accordance with the 2010/2011 General Elections Roadmap.

Other measures adopted to improve the management of the elections were online access to the National Voters' Register, use of SMS to access personal details from the voters' register, and allowing Political Parties/Organizations access ballot paper printing process and packing of election materials.

2.4 PHASED FUNDING OF THE 2010/2011 GENERAL ELECTIONS PROJECT

The Electoral Commission is funded within the ceilings provided for under the Medium Term Expenditure Framework (MTEF) and funds released on a quarterly basis during the election year. Previous general elections were characterized by late enactment/passing of the electoral enabling laws and inadequate/late release of funding and consequently inadequate time to execute planned activities including procurement of election materials. In order to avoid these delays, the Electoral Commission in 2008 developed a project proposal for 2010/2011 General Elections, where the Government was requested to exempt it from the MTEF ceilings; that the electoral activities leading to the General Elections be treated as a project; and funded over a period of three (3) Financial Years beginning with Phase I, during the Financial Year (FY) 2008/09.

The phased approach was intended to ease funding pressure on Government. Other expected outputs include the following:-

- a. Informed stakeholders and the electorate through voter education in a timely manner;
- b. Production of a credible voters' register;
- c. Efficiency and effectiveness;
- d. Timely procurement of materials and equipment;
- e. Value for money; and
- f. A favourable working environment for all stakeholders.

The Commission submitted and discussed the project proposal with Government and other stakeholders, who were supportive. The actual expenditure for the project is detailed under Chapter Four.

2.4.1 Phase I: Plans for FY 2008/2009

The Commission planned the following activities in the Financial Year 2008/2009: procurement of data communication infrastructure, servers, computers, printers and accessories, voter registration forms, Biometric equipment (cameras and accessories) and motor vehicles.

During Phase I (FY 2008/2009), the Government released U.Shs. 6,226,140,000/= out of the budgeted U.Shs. 41,322,970,400/=. The funds released were inadequate for the procurement of specialized equipment identified for Phase I. The released funds were used to procure motor vehicles.

2.4.2 Phase II: Plans for FY 2009/2010

During this phase of the 2011 General Elections Roadmap, the Commission planned to procure specialized equipment, materials and computer software, deploy sub county and parish supervisors, re-organize polling stations and conduct the general update of the National Voters' Register.

Government released a sum of eighty eight billion eight hundred thirty six million nineteen thousand two hundred eighteen (Ug. Shs. 88,836,019,218) for the planned activities out of which thirty one billion (31,000,000,000/-) were transferred to the Ministry of Internal Affairs towards the purchase of the Biometric equipment.

2.4.3 Phase III: Plans for FY 2010/2011

The Government released a sum of Ug.Shs One hundred eighty five billion three hundred thirty nine million one hundred thirty thousand eight hundred (185,339,130,800/-) for the third phase under the Financial Year 2010/2011. A total of Shs. 102,000,000,000/= was under MTEF while 83,000,000,000/= was supplementary funding due to creation of thirty two (32) new districts and amendment to the electoral laws. This funding catered for the display of the National Voters' Register, voter education and publicity, nomination of candidates for various levels of elections, procurement of ballot papers for various levels and conduct of election activities at various levels, among others.

2.5 THE 2010/2011 GENERAL ELECTIONS ROADMAP

The aim of the 2010/2011 General Elections Roadmap was to improve the state of preparedness, efficiency and effectiveness for the elections. The Constitution sets statutory deadlines for the polling period as an indicator for holding elections (Articles 61(2), (3) and (4) of the Constitution). Accordingly, the term of office for all elected leaders was to expire on 12th May 2011. Therefore, the polling for the 2010/2011 General Elections had to be held between 12th February and 13th March 2011. This set the primary benchmark for the 2010/2011 General Elections.

2.6 OBJECTIVES OF THE ROADMAP

The Commission drew the 2010/2011 General Elections Roadmap whose major objectives were to:-

- a.** Avoid last minute rush in implementation of election activities;
- b.** Provide a tool for better planning, implementation, benchmarking activities and assess their implementation;
- c.** Improve election management;
- d.** Improve stakeholder participation in the electoral process; and

- e. Deliver election results in time.

The Roadmap highlighted the activities with clear timelines, target dates, and budgetary requirements. The budget for the 2010/11 was approved by Government and the information shared with all stakeholders. The Roadmap was, however, continuously adjusted to fit within the available funding and other variables. The final version of the Roadmap is at **Appendix II**.

2.7 PROCUREMENT OF ELECTION MATERIALS

The Electoral Commission required different equipment and materials to conduct the 2010/2011 General Elections. The value, sensitivity and large volume of data which the Commission handles, processes and stores require up-to-date facilities and software.

The Commission procured Data Communication Infrastructure, Servers, Computers and printers with their accessories, Software upgrade and maintenance for the Storage Area Network (SAN), Transparent Ballot Boxes, Metallic Boxes for transportation and storage of election materials, mapping equipment, and Printery and graphic machines and accessories.

2.7.1 Specialized Equipment

The Commission had been using Digital Cameras with single storage of data on diskettes that were procured at the inception of the Photographic Voters Registration and Identification System (PVRIS) Project in 2000. The cameras were incompatible with the new technology; use diskette technology which is outdated and are not being routinely manufactured. By April 2010, there were only 3,000 out of 5,000 cameras which were functioning.

The cameras were inadequate for the General Update of the National Voters' Registers (NVR) that was scheduled for 3rd May – 18th June 2010. A camera was required in each of the 7,227 Parishes. The Electoral Commission, therefore, replaced the entire old camera with enrollment kits that consisted of a digital camera, signature pad, finger print scanner, and external drivers for storage, chargers and Image Backups (**See Plate 2**)

The enrollment kits were procured for use during the National Security Information System (NSIS) Project, being undertaken by the Ministry of Internal Affairs. The enrollment kits were also used for tallying of the election results.

Other materials which were procured included - Indelible Ink, Seals, Basins, Ballot papers, Transparent Ballot Boxes and Desktop Computers.

The procurements were initially planned to be phased in three financial years 2008/2009, 2009/2010 and 2010/2011. However, due to resource constraints, it was only possible to carryout procurements in two financial years, - 2009/2010 and 2010/2011. The procurements were successfully undertaken.

The major challenge was that some of the election materials could not be locally produced and therefore, had to be imported. Secondly, the depreciation of the Uganda Shilling against major international currencies also affected the general price levels since the budget and the releases were fixed.

The suspicion from Political Stakeholders was a challenge too. However, transparent efforts were made including allowing delegation of Political Party representatives to go to one of the International Printing centres in UK to witness the ballot papers production.

CHAPTER THREE

COMPILATION OF ADMINISTRATIVE UNITS, DEMARCATION OF ELECTORAL AREAS AND RE-ORGANIZATION OF POLLING STATIONS

3.1 INTRODUCTION

The Constitution of the Republic of Uganda 1995 (as Amended) and other electoral laws provide for demarcation of electoral areas and establishment of polling stations.

3.2 COMPILATION OF ADMINISTRATIVE UNITS

The Commission compiled all the newly created Administrative Units and reconciled this information with data used during the 2005/2006 General Elections. The main objective was to update the 2005/2006 administrative units' database. The compilation exercise resulted into fifty seven thousand three hundred thirty five (57,335) villages, seven thousand two hundred twenty seven (7,227) parishes, one thousand three hundred twenty seven (1,327) sub counties, one hundred ninety four (194) counties, two hundred thirty eight (238) constituencies, all distributed in one hundred twelve (112) districts.

3.3 DEMARCATION OF CONSTITUENCIES/ELECTORAL AREAS

3.3.1 Parliamentary Constituencies

Article 63 of the Constitution, mandates the Electoral Commission to demarcate Constituencies taking into consideration the population quota, means of communication, geographical features, and that each county, as approved by parliament, has at least one Member of Parliament; except that no constituency shall fall within more than one county.

During the period under review, fourteen (14) new counties, namely Bugangaizi East, Buyaga West, Kasambya, Agule, Toroma, Budyobo, Bunyole West, Dodoth West, Nakaseke North, Iki-Iki, Budiope East, Ajuri, Bukooli Island, Katerera; and nine (09) municipalities, namely, Bushenyi – Ishaka, Hoima, Iganga, Kasese, Masindi, Mukono, Ntungamo, Rukungiri and Busia were created. These automatically became new parliamentary constituencies.

Parliament prescribed two hundred thirty eight (238) constituencies for the 2010/2011 general elections for purposes of electing Directly Elected Members into the 9th Parliament compared to two hundred fifteen (215), during the 2006 General Elections.

3.3.2 Demarcation of Local Government Council Electoral Areas

Following the creation of new districts, new sub counties/town councils and considering the results of the 2002 Population and Housing Census, the Commission demarcated boundaries of Electoral Areas for purposes of the 2010/2011, General Elections as provided for under Article 181 of the Constitution and Sections 23, 108, 109, 110 and 111 of the Local Governments Act, Cap 243.

The principles followed for demarcation of electoral areas (EAs) as derived from the laws are as follows;

- a.** The basic Administrative Units for representation at the relevant Local Government Councils (e.g. each sub county/town/municipal division must be represented by at least one person at the district council; each parish/ward must be represented by at least one person at the sub county /town/municipal division council);
- b.** No basic administrative unit shall be subdivided for purposes of adding part of it to another unit for the purpose of demarcation of administrative units;
- c.** Population quota as provided under Article 181 of the Constitution and Section 109(1) of the Local Governments Act, which provides, for example for 30,000 inhabitants in the case of a district level and 10,000 inhabitants in the case of sub county level;
- d.** The statutory requirement that women councillors constitute one third (1/3) of every Local Government council;

- e. Every Local Government must comprise of a minimum of 10 councilors; and
- f. Taking into account means of communication, geographical features, and population density.

At the end of the exercise, the total number of Electoral Areas for all categories of Local Governments for the General Elections 2010/2011 as compared to the 2001/2002, 2005/2006 General Elections is shown in **Table 1** below;

3.4 REORGANIZATION OF POLLING STATIONS

In accordance with the provisions of section 12 (1) of the Electoral Commission Act, (Cap 140), the Electoral Commission is required to establish and operate polling stations for purposes of elections.

The Commission embarked on the reorganization of polling stations from 18th January, 2010 to 1st February, 2010. The purpose of the exercise was to take services nearer to the

public. This was done by locating polling stations in central places, re-locating polling stations that were affected by infrastructural developments, splitting polling stations which had more than 800 voters, decongesting polling stations in a given polling centre and ensuring that each parish and electoral area had at least one polling station.

The reorganization exercise led to an increase in the total number of polling stations from 19,786 during the 2005/2006 elections to 23,968 during the 2010/2011 General Elections.

CHAPTER FOUR

GENERAL ADMINISTRATION, HUMAN RESOURCE AND FUNDING

4.1 GENERAL ADMINISTRATION

General administration involves logistical support to the Commission. During the period under review, the Commission provided storage, transport and other logistical support as and when they were needed.

4.1.1 Storage

The Commission uses rented warehouses in Luzira for storage of election materials and packing for elections. During the period under review, it became necessary to rent additional space. A warehouse on Plot 32, Mukabya Road in Banda along Jinja Road, Kampala, was accordingly hired for the purpose. The election materials stored and later packed in the ware houses included basins, ballot boxes (metallic and transparent). Other election materials stored and packed were indelible ink, ballot papers, the register and various election forms (**See Appendix III**).

The storage and packing space was adequate and this led to the smooth and meticulous packing of the update, nomination and polling kits.

4.1.2 Transport

During the 2010/2011 General Elections, the Commission provided transport facilitation for all activities leading to polling day. At the commencement of the Update exercise, the Commission had an old fleet of motor vehicles totaling one hundred and twenty six (126). These were not adequate for the smooth running of the update exercise and the subsequent election activities. As the procurement process progressed, a close partnership between the Electoral Commission and the Private Sector provided additional vehicles for the newly created districts and districts with non-functional vehicles.

Eighty seven (87) trucks were hired to distribute and retrieve the registration kits to and from the districts. Six (06) ‘30 Seater’ buses were also hired to ease transport for the manpower which was involved in the packing of the polling kit. Five extra vehicles were hired for the District Information Technology Officers (DITOs) who worked in the five divisions of Kampala district during the update exercise. The Commission hired a truck for each of the 112 (one hundred twelve) districts for distribution of the polling materials and the polling kits countrywide for each category of election. Additional five (5) trucks were hired for the five divisions in Kampala; and four other trucks (4) were hired for Wakiso District. These trucks were of different tonnage depending on the size of the district/city division and ranged from three to fifteen tones.

The Government facilitated the Commission with adequate funds to procure motor vehicles for the new districts, facilitated presidential candidates and also replaced some of the old vehicles. The following categories of vehicles were procured using the approved funds. Ninety seven (97) motor cycles for the districts; Ninety three (93) double cabin pick ups for districts; ten (10) Double cabin pick ups for security escorts of Presidential Candidates; eleven (11) station wagons for Presidential Candidates and the Chairman of the Electoral Commission; two (02) trucks (lorries); one (01) staff mini bus (30 seater) and sixteen (16) saloon cars. This transport facilitation enabled the Commission to go through the electoral process smoothly.

4.1.3 Distribution of Polling Materials and Supervision

An additional seven hundred sixty three (763) vehicles were mobilized from Ministries, Departments, Agencies and Local Governments, with the assistance from the Head of Public Service/Secretary to Cabinet. These vehicles were used for the supervision of election activities, distribution of polling materials, monitoring, and retrieval of results countrywide. The vehicles were deployed for a period of one month.

4.1.4 Provision of Power

In preparation for the update exercise, the Commission provided generators for charging Biometric Registration equipment countrywide. Furthermore, in order to provide a reliable and a stable power supply, a total of eighty (80) solar systems were procured and

installed in districts which lack access to the National Electricity Grid. A donation of six thousand solar lamps (6,000) were received from the Government of the Peoples' Republic of China and eighteen thousand (18,000) lamps were procured jointly by the Government of Uganda and the Deepening Democracy Program (DDP) under DANIDA. The lamps were used to provide light at the polling stations on polling days countrywide.

4.1.5 Communication

During the 2010/2011 General Elections, fast, accurate and modern communication and transmission linkages were installed for connectivity between field offices and the Electoral Commission Headquarters. Results were electronically transmitted using the Electronic Results Transmission and Dissemination Systems (ERTDS) donated by DANIDA. This system was hailed for its efficiency and transparency in disseminating the election results.

In addition, a toll free line number 0800200071 was installed to ease communication between the Commission and the stakeholders. Stakeholders and the general public used this line to seek clarification, report suspected cases of malpractice and raise issues related to the electoral process. Some of the Commission staff were connected through the Closed User Group package to ease communication. The Commission, with the assistance from donors (USAID), provided registered voters with the option to send short messages (SMS) and access their registration status. Voters were also able to access the National Voters' Register online, which was affordable and time saving.

The Commission also procured and installed one hundred and five (105) fax machines as a backup in the transmission of election results to the National Tally Centre at the Mandela National Stadium, Namboole.

4.1.6 Security during the General Elections

Section 12 (1)(f) of the Electoral Commission Act, Cap 140, requires the Commission to take steps to ensure that there are secure conditions necessary for the conduct of any election in accordance with the Act or any other law.

The Electoral Commission and the Uganda Police Force, through training workshops and seminars ensured that the police and other security officers on election duty were well informed of their roles, duties and obligations throughout the whole electoral process. The Commission closely liaised with the Uganda Police Force which coordinated the security detail during the General Elections.

The Commission working with the Police produced police guidelines on the security and electoral process, in a pocket fact format, which was distributed to all the officers and men of the Police.

The Uganda Police Force was the lead security agency in providing security. It provided polling constables at all polling stations, escorted election materials and generally secured the electoral environment. The Political Crimes Management Department of the Uganda Police rendered invaluable services in the electoral process in each sub-county countryside.

During the campaign period, the Commission, in liaison with the Uganda Police, provided escort teams to Presidential candidates. The Commission facilitated each of the escort vehicles. The Police ensured adequate security at all the campaign venues countrywide. The security was also beefed up at the Commission Headquarters and warehouses during the 2010/2011 General Elections.

4.1.7 Dispatch of Election Materials

4.1.7.1 Update Kits for the Registration Exercise

Dispatch of election materials commenced with the Update Biometric Registration kits which were stored in Banda warehouse. Hired trucks transported the kits to all the 112 districts. The Uganda Police provided security from the warehouses to the district headquarters. The kits were then distributed by district officials to sub counties and parishes for the registration exercise to commence. After the registration exercise, the kits were transported back to the ware houses for safe custody and the registration returns brought to the headquarters for processing.

4.1.7.2 Dispatch of the Polling Kit

Dispatch of the materials for polling day commenced with the delivery of empty transparent ballot boxes, cordoning tapes (for delineating polling stations) and basins. Trucks were hired per district to transport the materials which were stored and secured at the district headquarters until the eve of the polling days.

The dispatch of the metallic boxes containing election materials for the different categories of elections (Presidential and Parliamentary, Local Government Council V, Municipality/City Division, and Local Government Council III Elections) was done from the Warehouse in Banda to the districts, three days before polling. A day before the respective polling days, the polling kits were transported from the district headquarters to the sub county headquarters from where they were finally collected by the respective Presiding Officers on the polling days. The polling kits were escorted by the political parties under the Interparty Cooperation. The dispatch for the Kampala District elections, however, was done directly to the polling stations from Banda Warehouse, in the wee hours of the polling day.

4.2 HUMAN RESOURCE

4.2.1 Introduction

The Electoral Commission has a knowledgeable, skilled and experienced human resource at its disposal. This resource which is highly dedicated played a crucial role in organizing, conducting and supervising the 2010/2011 General Elections.

During the period under review, the Commission filled eighty one (81) vacancies at Assistant District Registrar level. The new Officers were inducted and deployed in their districts in time to monitor and supervise the final stages (campaigns, polling day) of the electoral process.

4.2.2 The Electoral Commission Workforce

4.2.2.1 Regular and Seconded staff

The Commission has a total workforce of six hundred seventy four (674).

The Commission detached itself from the local governments' staff by using its own Election Temporary Officials, 1,327 at the sub-county and 7,234 at the parish levels, in the conduct of the 2010/2011, General Elections. This was a big achievement which further strengthened the independence of the Commission.

4.2.2.2 Temporary Staff

(a) Sub-County and Parish Election Supervisors

In the Constitutional Court case; **Rubaramira Ruranga Vs Attorney General**, court, among others, recommended that the sub-county and parish chiefs should be replaced with independent Sub-County and Parish Election Supervisors who are recruited and appointed by the Electoral Commission.

This recommendation was implemented by the Commission during the period under review. The Commission advertised, short listed, interviewed, recruited, trained and deployed one thousand three hundred twenty seven (1,327) Sub-County Supervisors and seven thousand two hundred thirty four (7,234) Parish Supervisors for a period of one year. However, the recruitment and deployment of this category of staff requires a substantial amount of financial resources for it to be sustained.

(b) District Information Technology Officers (DITOs)

During the implementation of the Biometric Voter Registration exercise, the Commission required the services of technical staff to ensure that the new technology operated properly. The Commission accordingly liaised with the National Information Technology Authority (Uganda) (NITA-U)) who initially seconded 91 Information Technology (IT) Officers and later raised the number to one hundred sixteen (116) to cater for the increase in the number of Districts. These District IT Officers were deployed in all the districts and the five divisions of Kampala.

The DITOs closely supervised the update of the National Voters' Register. Their scope of work included providing technical support, training and trouble-shooting, in case of any system failure(s), data back up and transfer, maintenance of the Information Technology (IT) Systems hardware, software and infrastructure in the districts.

The DITOs later participated in the verification of the suspected duplicates/multiple registration in the National Voters' Register (NVR) using Fingerprints and the Facial Recognition System.

(c) Update/Enrollment and Display Officers

The update of the National Voters' Register was conducted from 3rd May 2010 to 18th June, 2010, during which, the Commission recruited eight thousand (8,000) Update/Enrollment Officers to operate the 4,000 registration kits. In addition, display officers were recruited, trained and deployed in each polling station from 11th August, 2010 to 13th September, 2010, for purposes of the display of the National Voters' Register.

(d) Drivers of Mobilized Vehicles

Seven hundred sixty three (763) vehicles and their drivers were mobilized, with the assistance from the Head of Public Service /Secretary to Cabinet. The Commission accordingly deployed the drivers and paid their allowances for a period of one month.

4.3 FINANCING OF THE 2010/2011 – GENERAL ELECTIONS

4.3.1 Introduction

The 2010/2011 General Elections were basically financed by the Government of the Republic of Uganda. A total budget of Uganda Shillings two hundred eighty billion one hundred fifteen million six hundred seventy eight thousand eight hundred forty eight (280,115,678,848) only was approved for the General Elections in a phased manner, over a period of three (3) Financial Years. A sum of Uganda Shillings six billion two hundred twenty five million one hundred forty thousand (6,225,140,000) only was released during the FY2008/09; Ug. Shs. eighty eight billion eight hundred thirty six million nineteen thousand two hundred eighteen (88,836,019,218) only was released in the FY2009/10; and Ug.shs One hundred two billion three hundred and thirty nine million, one hundred thirty thousand eight hundred (102,339,130,800) only was approved for the FY2010/11 and a supplementary funding of Uganda shillings eighty three billion (83,000,000,000) only was later approved to cater for additional costs related to new districts and the supervisors. This amounted to a total of One hundred eight five billion three hundred thirty nine million one hundred thirty thousand eight hundred (185,339,130,800) only for the FY2010/11.

4.3.2 Details of General Election 2010/11 Expenditure

The general election funds were expended as indicated in **Table 3** below:

During Phase II, the Commission procured Presidential campaign vehicles, services for the upgrade of the SAN server and data center software, re-design and building the Local Area Network (LAN), Printing Machine, General Polling Materials, Voter Education and Transparent Ballot Boxes. Thirty billion shillings (30,000,000,000/=) for procuring Biometric System were transferred to the Ministry of Internal Affairs which procured the equipment. The procured equipment was later released to the Commission for use during the update of the National Votes' register.

The Government approved and released a total sum of Uganda Shillings one hundred eighty five billion, six million eight hundred forty six thousand six hundred twenty eight (185,006,846,628) only for Phase III. However, the Commission spent Ug. Shs. 204,526,012,411/= which resulted

into an over expenditure of Shs. 19,519,165,783/=. This was as a result of the conduct of Youth Councils/Committees Elections which were scheduled for FY 2011/2012, without funds allocated during the FY 2010/2011. Consequently, the Commission was unable to settle taxes on ballot papers amounting to Ug. Shs. 19,565,694,217/=

4.3.3 Donor Funding

On 30th July 2009, the Commission held a workshop to brief the Development Partners on the 2011 General Elections Roadmap. The Donor Community agreed and provided funding towards the implementation of the youth voter education project in Northern Uganda, a face to face voter education programme in the Near East Region and the integration of voter education in Uganda school curriculum, coordinated by the National Curriculum Development Centre (NCDC) in Kyambogo, on a pilot study basis.

During the Financial Year 2009/2010 the Commission received a donation of 70 lap tops, 6000 solar lamps, 307 computers, 101 printers and 4 scanners from to the Government of the Peoples' Republic of China. The European Union donated Shillings nine hundred twenty one million three hundred forty three thousand five hundred (921,343,500) out of which Shillings eight hundred forty million four hundred fifty two thousand five hundred shillings (Ug. Shs. 840,452,500) was spent. Breakdown of the expenditure is indicated in **Table 4**. DANIDA under the Enhancing the Integrity of Elections in Uganda donated a total sum of Uganda Shillings five billion, one hundred forty seven million, five hundred twenty five thousand and five hundred only (5,147,525,500) out of which Shillings four billion four hundred ninety six million, eight hundred eighty thousand (4,496,496,880) was received. A breakdown of the expenditure of DANIDA funds is indicated in **Table 5**. **Table 4** below shows the actual expenditure during the elections and the source of funds.

CHAPTER FIVE

VOTER REGISTRATION/GENERAL UPDATE AND DISPLAY OF THE NATIONAL VOTERS' REGISTER (NVR)

5.1 INTRODUCTION

Voter registration is an important aspect of an election and is a mandatory requirement for voting under the 1995 Constitution of the Republic of Uganda (Article 59). The backbone of a free and fair election and referendum is a credible voters' register which should be accurate since it determines who can vote during an election or referendum. An accurate register is one that includes all and only eligible voters correctly registered and placed on the voting rolls where each individual applied and is qualified to register and vote. The law provides that people can register and vote from where they originate or reside.

The Constitution of the Republic of Uganda 1995 (as Amended) and other electoral laws require the Electoral Commission to compile, maintain, revise and update the National Voters' Register. However, registration is optional.

During the 2010/2011, General Elections, the National Voters' Register (NVR) was updated by the update/enrollment officers country-wide. This exercise aimed at capturing new voters and facilitating transfers of voters. After the update of the National Voters' Register, it was cleaned and taken back to the field for the display exercise. The display exercises aimed at enabling voters confirm whether they are on the register and object to the inclusion of non-eligible voters and the omission of eligible voters.

5.2 GENERAL UPDATE OF THE NATIONAL VOTERS' REGISTER

The general update of the national voters' register was conducted in preparation for the 2010/2011, General Elections. The effective capture of returns commenced with the closure of the continuous registration of new voters and the cut-off date for registration of voters.

During the update exercise, the Commission replaced the Digital Cameras with a biometric system which integrated a finger print reader, and signature scanner, and more robust software to capture more information from eligible voters. The objectives of using the biometric technology during the update exercise were to;

- i.** Capture bio-data of newly eligible voter;
- ii.** Enhance voter identity;
- iii.** Detect and avoid attempts to double registration;
- iv.** Initiate formation of a national databank; and
- v.** Subsequent issuance of the National Identity cards (to be distributed by the Ministry of Internal Affairs and to be used in voter identification in future).

The general update exercise commenced on 3rd May, 2010 and ended on 18th June, 2010. The Commission had originally planned for a thirty (30) days update exercise from 3rd May to 4th June 2010. However, this period had to be extended for ten (10) extra days to 14th June 2010 and a further final extension of four (4) days to 18th June 2010, to accommodate the public that turned up for the registration exercise. The exercise was thus, conducted for a total of 44 days. The publishing and gazetting of the updated polling stations was done on 10th December 2010, in accordance with the law.

During the update exercise, mobile teams were deployed per parish and extra teams were deployed in Kampala and Wakiso districts due to high population density. Registration Centres were also set up at Kololo Airstrip and the Constitutional Square. It was evident that in some districts, registration of new voters was concluded much earlier than the projected program, thereafter, their equipment was withdrawn and taken to the areas where demand was still apparent.

During the implementation of the project, the District Information Technology Officers (DITOs) were deployed to work at the district to provide technical support to the Enrollment/Update Officers and the Returning Officers. The DITOs were trained by the technical team provided by the Supplier (See Plate 3).

5.2.1 Processing Of Update Returns

Processing of update returns commenced on 20th June 2010 at the Electoral Commission headquarters. Four million six hundred twenty four thousand six hundred and two (4,624,602) newly captured voter data was integrated into the 10.5 Million old data. Duplicate analysis was done using Facial Recognition and Finger Print Technology. The recommended deletions were printed into a separate register and displayed along side the display register, for confirmation. Capturing of update returns and processing of the voters' register for display was on schedule as per the Roadmap and enabled the printing of the national voters' register by 31st July 2010, as scheduled.

5.2.2 Outcome of the Update Exercise

The number of registered voters as of September 29th, 2005 was 10.5 Million Voters in the NVR. The Commission projected to register an additional 3.5 million voters during the general update of the voters' register.

At the end of the update exercise a total of 4,624,602 eligible voters were captured as new applicants, retakes and transfers, bringing the voter population to 15,002,720 registered voters during this exercise. Adequate time was allocated to capture the returns and process the register for display.

5.3 DISPLAY OF THE NATIONAL VOTERS' REGISTER

The Electoral Commission is required under Section 25 of the Electoral Commission Act, to display the national voters' register for a period of at least 21 days. An additional ten (10) days is allowed for natural justice, making a total display period of 31 days,

During the display exercise, voters have the opportunity to raise objections regarding inaccurate information on the register. The voters also confirm their registration status. The law provides for tribunals to participate in identifying eligible voters in their respective parishes. The tribunals are recruited and appointed by Chief Magistrates of the Magisterial area.

The display exercise took place for the mandatory period of twenty one (21) days from 11th to 31st August 2010, as scheduled. Overall, the display exercise was successfully conducted.

In accordance with Section 25 of the Electoral Commission Act, the National Voters' Register was displayed at each of the polling stations countrywide from 11th August, 2010 to 31st August, 2010.

5.3.1 Appointment of Members of Parish Tribunals

Parish tribunals were appointed by the Judicial Officers in accordance with the provision of the law. The tribunals were responsible for confirming the correctness of the recommended changes during the display period.

5.3.2 Natural Justice Period

In accordance with the law, an additional period of ten (10) days starting from 1st to 10th September 2010 was published as the period for natural justice. During this time, all recommendations/objections that had been endorsed by the parish tribunals were displayed at the parish headquarters to enable interested parties make counter objections.

5.4 Processing of Display Returns

After the display exercise and the natural justice period, the Commission redeployed the Election Assistants from the districts, together with headquarter staff to process the display returns. During the analysis of the returns, some duplicate voters were identified and removed from the National Voters' Register. At the end of the exercise, a total of 13.9 million registered voters remained on the National Voters' Register. They were spread in the twenty three thousand nine hundred sixty eight (23,968) polling stations country wide.

CHAPTER SIX

VOTER EDUCATION, TRAINING AND PUBLICITY

6.1 VOTER EDUCATION AND TRAINING

Article 1 of the Constitution of the Republic of Uganda 1995 (as Amended) vests all power in the people of Uganda. The people are required to exercise their sovereignty in accordance with the law. In order to exercise this responsibility, the people must be informed. An informed electorate is empowered. Voter Education creates awareness and knowledge among the electorate and spells out the roles of the various stakeholders in the whole electoral process.

During the period under review, the Commission intensified voter education at all stages of the electoral process. Seventy one (71) Non-Governmental and Civil Society Organizations were accredited to carry out and conduct voter education using the curricula developed by the Commission.

The accredited organizations were briefed in a one-day workshop on the guidelines on the conduct of voter education. A code of conduct was accordingly signed between the Commission and accredited organisations on 12th May, 2010 at Hotel Africana. On 20th May, 2010, voter education by these organizations was launched.

In an effort to enhance voter education, the Commission contracted the following firms to carry out voter education in the Eastern, Western, Central and Northern Uganda; Uganda Project Implementation Management Advocacy Consultancy (UPIMAC) (East), Impact Associates (Western), CPD &ZK (Central) and Vantage Communications (Northern).

The contracted firms delivered relevant messages at every stage and level of the electoral process.

The Commission and the contracted firms adopted the following strategies in the conduct of voter education:

- i. Foot personnel using megaphones and moving from door-to-door in hard to reach areas such as remote villages, slums and in places with rare accessibility to the media;
- ii. Special events targeting the youths, through musical shows, road blitzes and entertainment spots involving popular artists; and
- iii. The Commission also produced promotional materials and issued radio and television, print media, and audio visual aids to re-enforce the voter education and publicity drives.

M/S Felma Media Agency, a consultancy communication firm was engaged to develop messages and monitor media coverage of voter education messages country wide. It also produced educational materials such as flyers and T-Shirts.

6.2 TRAINING OF ELECTION OFFICIALS AND OTHER STAKEHOLDERS

One of the Electoral Commission's strategies during the 2010/2011, General Elections was to carry out a comprehensive training programme for its election officials and other major stakeholders. Accordingly, Returning Officers, Assistants Returning Officers, District Registrars, Assistants District Registrars, Sub County and Parish Supervisors, were trained as Trainers of Trainers (TOTs). These in turn trained the Reorganization Officers, Enrolment and Update Officers, Members of Parish Tribunal, District Information Technology Officers (DITOs), New Electoral Commission staff, Display Officers, Presiding officers, Polling Assistants, Polling Constables, Tally Clerks, Political Party/Organization/Candidates' Agents/representatives.

The Commission also organized national, regional and district training workshops which were beneficial to the media personnel, security officials, accredited NGO's, opinion leaders, political parties/agents, district and local leaders and other stakeholders.

The Electoral Commission also organised specialised training for both the district and headquarter staff. The program was facilitated by Building Resources in Democracy, Governance and Elections (BRIDGE).

The Commission sensitized stakeholders through regular briefing on the modalities for all the electoral activities. The Commission conducted public awareness campaigns through regular briefings of stakeholders on the modalities for all the electoral activities. The briefings were conducted at the eight (8) regional centres and the stakeholders that benefited from the programmes included political parties/organizations, security agencies, Non governmental Organizations (NGOs) and Civil Society Organizations, Donor Community, Local Government / District staff and the Press.

6.3 PROMOTIONAL MATERIALS

During the 2010/2011 General Elections, the Commission produced various voter education materials and translated them into different local languages. These materials included:

- i.** Posters, Stickers, Banners, Street Posters, Brochures and Fliers,
- ii.** Handbooks, Guidelines, and pocket facts on elections;
- iii.** Information Education Communication (I.E.C) Materials such as Souvenirs, T-Shirts, Caps, Corporate Pens; and
- iv.** Publications using Calendars, Newsletters and Diaries.

A lot of media airtime was booked on most community radios and television stations country-wide, supplemented by spot messages, advertisements, talk shows and Disc-Jockey (DJ) mentions. Furthermore, the following methods of voter education and publicity were undertaken:

- Radio Announcements on a daily basis across radio stations;
- Billboards and Street Poles that were hoisted in each district and urban centers country wide;

- Double-faced billboards were placed at strategic locations to allow accessibility, sharing of voter education messages and publicity purposes;
- Radio spots placement;
- Newspaper advertisements in the major newspapers;
- Drama competition, civic essay competition, public lectures run in secondary schools and tertiary institutions in Northern Uganda;
- Election information integrated into curriculum for primary and secondary education;
- Voter education election songs used in road shows/blitzes and on radio;
- T-shirts
- Pull-outs in media inserts;
- Radio presenter support from radio stations.
- Audio Visual messages for Television;
- Audio Messages;
- Training sessions conducted in Universities;
- Talk-shows;
- TV Announcements with sign language;
- Television shows;
- Road shows and blitzes in rural communities and densely populated areas;
- Face to Face Interactions;
- SMS messages for voters to know where to vote;
- Messages hosted on websites (New Vision, Monitor Newspapers and the Independent magazine);
- Voter education films shown at night in the urban areas;
- Voter education films in Luganda, Rukiga, Runyankore, Runyoro/Rutoro and Luo languages.

6.4 DONOR FUNDING AND VOTER EDUCATION

The European Union funded the following voter education activities during the 2010/2011 General Elections.

- Sensitizing the youth in Secondary and Tertiary Institutions in Northern Uganda;

- Integration of Voter Education into primary curriculum;
- Integration of Voter Education into Secondary curriculum;
- Integration of Voter Education into Functional Adult Literacy Programme;
- Production of a film on the electoral process, and
- Face-to-Face interaction with voters in the Near East Region.

6.4.1 Activities Implemented Under European Union Donor Support

- Briefing of over one thousand (1000) stakeholders in Northern Uganda held on 23rd – 26th February, 2009 which marked the launch of the project;
- Conduct of Training of Trainers for sixteen (16) project managers (Electoral Commission District staff) from 23rd – 27th February, 2009;
- Two public lectures were held in Arua and Lira to brief stakeholders;
- Conduct of talk shows on four local radio stations to publicize the activities in Northern Uganda;
- The training of teacher trainers was conducted from 26th – 31st March, 2009;
- The integration of Voter Education into the school curriculum for primary and secondary programme was launched at the National Curriculum Development centre on 1st April, 2009;
- Development of teacher's guides, manuals and resource books was done during the workshop held at Curriculum Development Centre from 25th – 31st June, 2009;
- Pre-visits to selected schools in eight districts were done between 1st – 20th July, 2009;
- Inter-school drama competitions were conducted in the Northern Region in sixteen (16) secondary schools. The final competition was held in Lira on 8th August, 2009;
- A workshop was held in Mukono from 16th – 22nd August to integrate voter education into Functional Adult Literacy Programme;
- Designing trial test instruments for selected schools was conducted from 11th – 14th November, 2009;
- Inter-School Essay competitions were conducted in Secondary/Tertiary Institutions in Northern Uganda;

- Production of a film depicting the entire electoral process (Fair Play);
- Face-to-face interactions with voters in the Near East Region covering sixteen (16) districts namely; Kamuli Bududa, Pallisa, Mbale, Mayuge, Jinja, Iganga, Namutumba, Budaka, Busia, Bugiri, Tororo, Kaliro, Sironko, Butalejja, Manafa.

6.4.2 Activities Implemented Under Deepening Democracy Program Donor Support

- Three manuals were reviewed in preparation for General Elections. They included; the Facilitators Manual, Election Officers Manual and Returning Officers Manual.
- A handbook for the Parish Tribunal Members was produced and printed at a cost of shillings 21,535,000.
- Top-up on Allowances for Parish Tribunal Members amounting to Ug.shs. 356,950,000/= was paid.
- Electoral Administration workshops for Returning Officers and Assistant Returning Officers were held at the Regional Centres of Kabarole, Mbarara, Masaka, Kampala, Mbale, Soroti, Lira and Arua to equip the Officers with skills to manage General Elections 2011.
- Four staff members were selected for specialised attachment to Sister Electoral Management Bodies in Ghana, South Africa and Tanzania in order to enhance their skills in managing elections.
- Customization of Political Parties desk and Acquisition of management software, stationery (giant stapling machines, box files, file covers, spiral binding machine), Office furniture (Executive desks, rolling chairs and office chairs) and office items (Curtains, metallic filling cabinets), office equipment (desktop computers, Ricoh printer with accessories)
- Acquisition of software for tallying and transmission of election results at a cost of Ug. Shs. 1,744,020,756.
- Facilitation for regional workshops for briefing of Security personnel (Resident District Commissioners, Regional Police Commanders, District Internal Security Officer, District Police Commanders, and Political Commissars.
- Printing of manuals for election officials (Facilitators Manual, Election Officers Manual and the Returning Officers Manual)

- Public Information campaign in northern Uganda to explain the process on campaigns and polling.
- Printing of three types of posters in sixteen local languages on campaigns and polling.
- Acquisition and Customization of a tracking system for Complaints/Petitions software.

6.5 PUBLICITY DURING THE 2010/2011 GENERAL ELECTIONS

During the period under review, the Commission disseminated information on the electoral process and highlighted the following activities: update of the voters' register, display of the voters' register, nominations of candidates, the campaign period and polling day activities.

The following publicity activities were also undertaken: weekly press briefing, press releases, media conferences and advocacy prayers with religious leaders. (See Plate 5).

6.6 THE MEDIA

The media played an important role in the dissemination of information and unfolding events during the electoral process. The responsibilities of the media include educating the public on the different electoral programs, as well as against acts of election related malpractices and violence; and encouraging voters and stockholders' participation in the electoral process.

The Electoral Commission has an open-door policy which seeks to respond to inquiries as fast as possible. Under this policy, the Commission expeditiously responded to media inquiries and responded to all queries as raised at every stage of the electoral process.

6.7 PUBLICITY OUTPUTS

The above strategies yielded the following outputs:-

- i.** An informed electorate and public on the election programs, procedures and election related malpractices and offences;
- ii.** Provision of opportunity for feedback from the public/audience, specifically during live radio and television talk shows (phone-ins);
- iii.** Wider outreach and messages understood through several media outlets countrywide; and
- iv.** Accessibility to messages translated into local languages.

CHAPTER SEVEN

NOMINATION OF CANDIDATES AND THE CAMPAIGN PERIOD

7.1 INTRODUCTION

In accordance with Sections 8 of the Presidential Elections Act, 9 of the Parliamentary Election Act and 119 of the Local Governments Election Act, the Electoral Commission appointed nomination days, places and times for nomination of candidates. (See Table 6).

The Commission required three and a half (3½) months to sort, edit, print, and deliver ballot papers for LC III. This implied that nomination for LC III candidates had to take place before the Parliamentary and District Local Government Councils (LCV) candidates. Therefore, the nomination of candidates for LC III took place from the 27th October – 2nd November 2010.

The printing and delivery of ballot papers was completed by 31st January 2011, thereby allowing time for packing and delivery of polling kits to the districts on schedule.

Section 21(1) of Presidential Elections Act of 2005, requires the Commission to give sufficient time to allow presidential candidates campaign for at least one day in each district. Therefore, the nomination of Presidential Candidates was critical and had to be conducted between 25th October, 2010 and 26th October 2010, to allow time for harmonisation of campaign programmes and publicity, subject to the constitutional deadline for the conduct of the polls.

7.2 NOMINATION OF PRESIDENTIAL CANDIDATES

The nominations of Presidential Candidates were presided over by the Chairperson of the Electoral Commission, as the National Returning Officer for the Presidential nominations. The requirements for nomination of the Presidential Candidates are provided for under Section 10 of the Presidential Elections Act, 2005 (as Amended). The candidates are required under this provision, to be supported by not less than one hundred registered voters in each of at least two thirds of the districts of Uganda. During the period under review Uganda had 112 districts. Other requirements include being a citizen of Uganda, must be between 35 and 75 years, possess an advanced level of education or its equivalent and must be a registered voter.

The aspiring Presidential candidates were encouraged to submit the lists of their supporters to the Electoral Commission for verification at least two (2) weeks before the nomination dates to allow adequate time for verification of voter authenticity as part of compliance with nomination requirements.

A total of fifty eight (58) aspirants picked nomination forms, however, only eight (08) candidates successfully met all the requirements and hence were nominated as Presidential candidates for the 2010/2011 General Elections.

Only one independent presidential candidate turned up for nominations. The summary of nominated candidates for the Presidential elections 2010/2011 is shown in **Table 7**

Each of the eight (08) presidential candidates was provided with one Station Wagon vehicle, a Double cabin pick up and facilitation of Uganda Shillings twenty million

(20,000,000/=). The pick ups were fully fueled for use by Government facilitated security detail for each candidate as provided for in the law.

7.3 NOMINATION OF PARLIAMENTARY CANDIDATES

Nominations of Directly Elected Members of Parliament and District Women Members of Parliament took place on 25th and 26th November 2010 at each district Headquarter.

The nominations were conducted by the District Returning Officers as gazetted. At the end of the nomination exercise, one thousand two hundred sixty nine (1,269) candidates were nominated to contest as Directly Elected Members of Parliament and four hundred forty four (444) Candidates nominated to contest as District Woman Representative to Parliament for the one hundred and twelve (112) districts.

The nominated candidates for Directly Elected Members of Parliament by political affiliation and gender are in **Table 8:**

After the close of the nomination exercise four (04) candidates from the National Resistance Movement (NRM) emerged unopposed for the parliamentary seat.

7.4 NOMINATION OF CANDIDATES FOR LOCAL GOVERNMENT COUNCILS

The qualifications and requirements for nomination of candidates for local government council's elections are provided for in the Local Governments Act, Cap 243, Section 117-128 namely;

- i.** Candidates for chairpersons of district /city are required to have completed a minimum education of Advanced level or its equivalent;
- ii.** Must be a citizen of Uganda and registered voter; and
- iii.** Academic qualifications are not required for nomination to contest at the other Local Government council levels.

Table 9 shows Nominated Candidates at Local Government Council levels by Political Party Affiliation at Local government council levels

At the end of the nomination exercise, a total of 36,827 candidates were nominated to contest for the various elective posts at the local government councils.

7.5 CAMPAIGN PERIOD FOR PRESIDENTIAL, PARLIAMENTARY AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT COUNCILS ELECTIONS

The Presidential Elections Act (PEA) provides that the Presidential Candidates should campaign for at least one day in each District. With one hundred twelve (112) districts, the campaigns commenced on 28th November, 2010 and ended on 16th February 2011.

Campaign programs for the General Elections were scheduled as follows:-

7.6 SECURITY FOR CANDIDATES DURING THE CAMPAIGN PERIOD

The Commission, in liaison with the Uganda Police, provided escort teams for each of the Presidential candidates, including day and night residential security. The Uganda Police ensured that there was adequate security at all the campaign venues in the country. The campaign period was generally calm and peaceful.

During the Presidential campaigns, there were two reported incidences both identified with candidate Abed Bwanika and the Police in Masaka and Lira Districts. The main

cause was failure to adhere to campaign programs and venues. This problem was addressed by the Electoral Commission. During the campaign period one of the presidential vehicles got involved in a serious accident; fortunately with no grievous harm to the occupants. (See Plate 7)

7.7 COMPLAINTS/ PETITIONS

Article 61(1)(f) of the 1995 Constitution and Section 15 of the Electoral Commission Act ,Cap 140 mandates the Electoral Commission to hear and determine election complaints arising before and during polling. The Commission received and handled 358 pre-election complaints. The complaints lodged with the Commission covered two broad categories:-

- i.** Candidates who were allegedly nominated, but in non-compliance with electoral laws; and
- ii.** Candidates who were not nominated on alleged failure to satisfy the nomination.

The Commission handled each case on its merit and reversed twenty one (21) nominations and upheld ninety nine six (99) nominations. The High Court, however, reversed two (2) of the Commission's decisions that cancelled the said nominations. Table 10 Presents the Analysis of the Petitions per Category of Elections.

CHAPTER EIGHT

PRE-POLLING AND POLLING ACTIVITIES

8.1 INTRODUCTION

The printing of ballot papers for Presidential, Parliamentary and Local Government Councils' elections was one of the major activities undertaken in preparation for polling day activities. The printing of ballot papers commenced on 5th October, 2010 and ended on 31st January, 2011.

Accordingly, four (4) companies were awarded tenders to print, pack and deliver the ballot papers. These were Avic International Holding Corporation of the Peoples' Republic of China, Kalamazoo and Smith & Ouzman both of United Kingdom and Lithotech (PTY) of South Africa.

The Political Parties/Organizations and Candidates agents/ representatives observed the process of printing and delivery of ballot papers.

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8.2 PACKING AND DELIVERY OF POLLING KITS

8.2.1 Packing

Packing of the polling kits for the various levels of elections commenced on 12th January 2011. The contents of the polling kit included the following – ballot papers, register, polling forms, indelible ink, endorsing ink, stamp pad, pens, strings and polythene sheeting. See **Appendix III** for details.

The Commission mobilized personnel, prison warders inclusive, to re-enforce the Commission staff in the packing of polling kits. The packing process was concluded as scheduled.

8.2.2 Dispatch of Polling Materials

The dispatch of presidential and parliamentary polling kits was done on the 16th February, 2011. Similarly, in subsequent elections, dispatch of polling kits was done two days prior to the polling days to the districts.

The polling kits for each level of elections were delivered from the Headquarters to the Districts for onward distribution to Sub counties and polling stations, a day before the polling day and on schedule. The polling kits for Kampala District were dispatched directly from the warehouse to Polling Stations.

8.3 POLLING DAY ACTIVITIES

8.3.1 Polling Days

Article 103 (3) of the Constitution of the Republic of Uganda (1995) provides that the general elections shall take place during the first thirty (30) days of the last ninety (90) days before the expiration of the term of office of the President. This, constitutionally, fixes the expiry date of the term of office of the President on the 12th May of every general election year. The Commission therefore, in appointing polling days for the various elective offices, was guided by the foregoing constitutional provision. Polling for the said elective offices was scheduled as follows:-

The polling activities at each polling station were conducted by the Presiding Officers (1); Polling Assistants (4); Polling Constables (1); and an Orderly Officer (1) at the polling centres.

8.3.2 Polling Activities

In accordance with the Electoral Commission Act, the Commission provided a copy of the National Voters' Register, which was used during polling, to all the eight (08) Presidential and the other interested candidates. Most of the candidates' agents had a copy of the voters' register at each polling station. The agents, using the said registers, cooperated with the polling officials in identifying the voters and made the polling process fast and transparent.

The Commission put in place a National Complaints Desk at the Commission Headquarters and at each of the Districts to handle complaints/inquiries raised on the polling days. At the Headquarters, a toll free line was installed, through the MTN Network as 0-800-2000-71, to expedite the complaints handling process. Polling was conducted between 7.00 am and 5.00pm country-wide. This was preceded by setting up the polling stations/centres. See **PLATE 8**.

Other activities included the counting of ballot papers, signing the necessary forms, announcing of winning candidates at the polling stations and delivery of the results to the collection centres.

The results (parliamentary and local government councils) from the collection centres were delivered to the District headquarters by the respective designated officers for tallying and consequent declaration of the winning candidates.

The presidential results were received by the respective District Registrars and transmitted to the National Tallying Centre where they were aggregated, ascertained and the winner declared by the Commission. Supervision of the polling day activities was done by the security personnel and the Commission staff.

8.3.3 Vote Counting, Announcement and Delivery of Results

On 18th February 2011, the Commission conducted Presidential and Parliamentary Elections. Counting of results was done at the respective polling stations for both Presidential and Parliamentary Elections. As provided by the law, a copy of the Declaration of Results Form was posted at each polling station for public viewing while another copy, together with the copy of Accountability of Ballot Papers (ABP) and the official report book, were sealed in tamper evident envelopes and delivered to the collection centres for onward delivery to the district tallying centres, escorted by the Political Parties'/Candidates' agents. This arrangement was equally applied in the local government council elections.

8.3.4 Transmission, Tallying, Ascertaining and Declaration of Results

Results for the Presidential Elections were announced at polling stations, delivered and tallied at District Tally Centres and thereafter transmitted to the National Tally Centre at the Nelson Mandela National Stadium, Namboole, in Wakiso District for aggregation, ascertaining and declaration by the respective District Returning Officers.

The Commission installed an Election Results Transmission and Dissemination System (ERTDS) with the assistance from Development Partners. The system eased the transmission of the 2010/2011 general elections. This enabled all the stakeholders, political parties/organizations/candidates' representatives, observers and the media to access the results immediately after verification by the Electoral Commission

A similar process was followed for the Parliamentary and Local government councils' elections at district level, except that the tallying and declarations of results was done by the respective Returning Officers at the District level.

The Presidential Election results for 2010/2011 are as summarized in **Tables 11** and details of the Presidential candidates' votes cast per district are in **Appendix V**

Candidate **YOWERI KAGUTA MUSEVENI** from the National Resistance Movement obtained the highest number of votes and was accordingly declared the winner of the 2010/2011 general presidential elections. The Presidential Elections Results were published in the Uganda Gazette Vol.CIV No.16; dated 4th March, 2011, General Notice No. 156 of 2011.

The detailed results are presented for Directly Elected Members of Parliament (**APPENDIX VI**) and District Woman Representative to Parliament (**Appendix VII**). The winners of the 2010/2011 Parliamentary Elections are in **Appendix VIII** (Directly Elected Members), **Appendix IX** (District Woman Representative to Parliament) and **Appendix X** (Special Interest Groups).

The summary of results for Female Candidates who contested in Constituencies for Directly Elected Members of Parliament during the 2010/2011 Parliamentary Elections are in **Table 12**.

8.4 ELECTIONS OF SPECIAL INTEREST GROUP (SIGS) REPRESENTATIVES

The Electoral Commission conducted the elections for Special Interest Groups (SIGs) representatives who include the Youth, PWDs, Workers and UPDF. The village, parish and sub county/town/municipality division youth council elections were held on 31/01/2011, 7/02/2011 and 14/02/2011. All Youth Council elections were completed by 12th March 2011. The polls for the Workers and PWD Members of Parliament were held from 13th to 15th February 2011 during their delegates' conferences at the Mandela National Stadium, Namboole and Mukono Colline Hotel, respectively.

8.5 RESIDUAL/RESCHEDULED ELECTIONS

The Commission rescheduled elections in some electoral areas, and conducted the same on subsequent dates, as a result of non-compliance with polling guidelines, violence and interference with the electoral process by some stakeholders, in the case of the Kampala Mayoral elections; and miss-spelt names, mix-up of candidates' symbols on the ballot paper in the other electoral areas. These residual elections were, however, very few and isolated and affected only Local Government Councils elections. Notably, violence and interference with the electoral process characterized the elections in Kampala, Sironko districts; and in Bubyangu sub-county in Mbale District where all the used election materials were burnt. More incidents of violence were reported in Nakaloke, Wanale, Bufumbo, Nyondo, Bukasakya sub-counties and Industrial Division in Mbale District. Investigations commenced, amidst mechanisms set up in place to ensure that elections were concluded in these electoral areas, and were not yet concluded by the time of submission of this report.

8.6 SWEARING - IN OF ELECTED LEADERS

8.6.1 PRESIDENT ELECT

Following the 2010/2011 Presidential Election, where H.E. Yoweri Kaguta Museveni, was declared winner, a swearing in ceremony was organised on 12th May, 2011 at the Kololo Ceremonial Grounds at Kampala, Uganda, which was highly attended by both the local and international dignitaries. A caption of the ceremony is indicated in **Plate 8**.

8.6.2 SWEARING - IN OF OTHER ELECTED LEADERS

The elected Members of the 9th Parliament were subsequently sworn-in on the 16th, 17th and 18th May, 2011 at the Parliamentary Buildings, Kampala; while the elected Chairpersons and Councillors at various Local Government Councils levels were later sworn in under the guidance of the Ministry of Local Government.

CHAPTER NINE

POLITICAL PARTIES/ORGANISATIONS AND OTHER STAKEHOLDERS

9.1 INTRODUCTION

The Political Parties and Organizations (PPOA) Act No. 18 of 2005, mandates the Electoral Commission to register political parties/organisations. The PPOA also provides for regulating, functioning of political parties and organizations, their formation, registration, membership and organization.

9.2 PARTICIPATION OF POLITICAL PARTIES/ORGANIZATIONS IN THE ELECTORAL PROCESS

Political parties as major players in the electoral process contributed to the success of the 2010/2011 General Elections. Fifteen (15) out of the 38 registered political parties participated at the various levels of the General Elections; and seven of these, namely; the National Resistance Movement (NRM), the Forum for Democratic Change (FDC), the Democratic Party (DP), the Peoples Progressive Party (PPP), Uganda Federal Alliance (UFA), the Peoples Development Party (PDP) and the Uganda Peoples' Congress (UPC), presented presidential candidates. The full list of the registered political parties and organizations are in **Appendix XI**.

9.3 NATIONAL CONSULTATIVE FORUM FOR POLITICAL PARTIES

Section 20 of the Political Parties and Organizations Act, 2005 provides for the formation of the National Consultative Forum for Political Parties and Organizations. The Forum was launched during a meeting held at Hotel Africana on 17th August 2010. Section 20A (1) of PPOA provides for the nomination of both the Chairperson and Vice Chairperson of the National Consultative Forum.

The chairperson is nominated from among members with the majority in Parliament and Vice Chairperson nominated by the majority opposition party in Parliament. Accordingly, during the launching of the Forum, the Vice Chairperson, Hon. Amanywa Mushega, FDC was nominated. The Political Party with the majority in Parliament recently nominated Hon. Dr. Ruhakana Rugunda, NRM as Chairperson of the Forum.

9.4 NATIONAL ELECTION LIAISON COMMITTEE

During the 2010/2011 General Elections, the Commission put in place a National Electoral Liaison Committee (NELC) at national level as well as the District Electoral Liaison Committee (DELIC). The main activity was to act as a stop gap measure for handling complaints/issues from the participating political parties and resolving any possible conflicts, in the absence of the National Consultative Forum for Political Parties and Organisations (NCF). The National Electoral Liaison Committee (NELC) comprised one member from each of the seven participating political parties that fielded presidential candidates, a representative of the independent presidential candidate, a representative of the Inspector General of Police and five technical officers from the Electoral Commission, three Commissioners (one of whom was the Chairperson).

The committee held several meetings between November, 2010 and February, 2011 during which various matters pertaining to the Presidential Campaigns were discussed and resolved. However, other election related complaints were handled by both District Officials and the Electoral Commission.

9.5 CODE OF CONDUCT FOR POLITICAL PARTIES

Section 19 of the Political Parties and Organizations Act, provides for a Code of Conduct for Political Parties and Organizations. Following a consultative meeting with political parties and other stakeholders in February, 2009, the Commission re-submitted the draft Code of Conduct and Regulations to the Ministry of Justice and Constitutional Affairs for consideration. By the time of the publication of this report, the Code of Conduct had not been passed by Parliament.

CHAPTER TEN

ELECTION OBSERVATION REPORTS

10.1 ELECTION OBSERVATIONS/MONITORING

Election observation and monitoring has become a common feature in election management. The general elections 2010/2011 attracted both local and international observers.

During the 2010/2011 General Elections, a total of three thousand six hundred ninety seven (3,497) observers were accredited to observe the General Elections. These included International Observers (706); National Observers (1,232); Political parties/organisation (369); International Press (116); National Press (533); and the National tallying process was observed by 541 observers.

The observers were facilitated with a kit whose content included guidelines, codes of conduct, Map of Uganda, electoral laws, the abridged 2010/2011 General Election Roadmap, the Handbook for Election Observers, Polling Station layout poster, voter education messages, telephone contacts of all District Returning Officers, contacts of the Uganda Police and materials on tourism in Uganda. Other items availed to observers included identification tags, pocket facts, writing pens, notebooks, brochures, observer Caps and T-Shirt.

Briefing and debriefing of the observers were conducted on the 15th and 19th February 2011, at the Sheraton Hotel, Kampala.

10.2 OBSERVER REPORTS

The international and national observers observed the whole electoral process and issued reports; wherein it was reported that the organization and overall electoral process conformed to rules and regulations set for free and fair elections; that the elections were free and fair, the election results were acceptable; and that there were marked improvements made during the 2011 elections over the 2006 General Elections. Other key areas reported include:-

- The 2011 General Elections were generally *freer* than the 2006 General Elections;
- The campaign period and the election day were peaceful and candidates largely restrained from abusive and threatening rhetoric;
- That the preparations for the elections demonstrated a considerable improvement over the previous elections. There was enhanced transparency in the process of voter registration, display of the national voters' register and distribution of voters' register to participating parties and independent candidates;
- The Electoral Commission's independence and state of readiness were generally applauded.
- Peaceful campaign and reasonable calm on Election Day in most areas.
- Quality of the legal framework improved election management, mostly free access to media and reduced rates of violence contributed to a *freer* political environment.
- The legal framework for freedom of assembly had been respected in most constituencies; and better than in 2006.
- The audit of the Electoral Commission register indicated positive growth.
- The Electoral Commission had largely performed its mandate transparently and neutrally. Local Electoral Commission officials were assessed to be knowledgeable, neutral and generally independent

10.2.1 Issues Raised by Observers to be improved upon

- Delays in the delivery of election materials in some polling stations;
- Imbalances in media reporting and coverage;
- The use of basins (as a voting booth) seems to compromise the secrecy of voting where ballot papers were long (length);
- Bribery and commercialization of elections in some areas;
- Enhancement of voter education on the polling processes for some officials;
- Missing names and mix-up in some voter locations;
- Uneveled playing ground for presidential candidates;
- Election violence and voter intimidation in some areas;

- Violation of the electoral guidelines by some stakeholders;
- Absence of legal limit to campaign expenditure; and
- Separation of Presidential/ General Parliamentary and Local Government Elections to reduce on voter fatigue and congestion.

10.2.2 Recommendations by Observers

Several teams presented their election observation reports with cross-cutting remarks. On the whole, it was observed that there were improvements made during the 2010/2011 elections compared to the elections conducted in 2005/2006. Some recommendations which were made include the following:

- Appointment process of the Members of the Commission requires involvement of greater consensus.
- Universal Adult Suffrage should be born in the legal formulation and conduct of the elections for Youth, Workers, PWDs and the UPDF representatives at the respective levels.
- Public display of the Voters' Register after processing the display returns should be undertaken.
- Enforcement of the legislation on the use of state and government resources.
- Establishment of an ad-hoc committee to review the practice and the law on campaign financing.
- Code of Conduct for Political Parties and Organizations should be in place.
- The Political Parties & Organization Act (PPOA) should be amended to promote affirmative action for women within Political Parties as provided in the Constitution, Local Government Act and Parliamentary Elections Act.
- Political Parties must exercise restraint on the security measures employed in the conduct of their campaigns.
- An independent Broadcasting Authority and independent Broadcast Complaints Commission should be created to act as a regulatory body.
- Separate timelines for conducting local government council elections and the Presidential/General parliamentary elections to reduce voter fatigue and congestion on the election calendar.

CHAPTER ELEVEN

CHALLENGES/CONSTRAINTS FACED BY THE COMMISSION

11.1 INTRODUCTION

Elections are not merely activities or events on the polling day. Elections encompass all stages of planning, registration of eligible voters, display of the voters' register, processing of display returns, nomination of candidates, campaigns, polling day and post polling day activities. Throughout the whole process, the participation and cooperation of all stakeholders is pertinent.

In the performance of its duties, the Electoral Commission put in place mechanisms to ensure transparency, accountability and impartiality throughout the electoral process. However, a few challenges were encountered in the process.

11.2 Voter Apathy

There was low turn up of voters during the local government council elections which could be attributed to voter fatigue or apathy. The country has numerous elective offices and various electoral cycles within the same period which leave the electorate fatigued. Active participation of voters is experienced during the Presidential and Parliamentary elections but decreases during the elections to lower offices. This enthusiasm was evident on polling day activities only at the expense of the other electoral activities like update of the voters' register and display of the voters' register. This resulted in some of the voters being recommended for deletion without their knowledge and counter objection.

11.3 Commercialization of Politics

Commercialization of politics is one of the causes of the electoral related malpractices and violence during the electoral process. A study by DEMGroup revealed that all

Political Parties were at fault with regard to commercialization of the electoral process. There was however, no quantitative revelation regarding amounts distributed by any party. The electorate needs to be educated on the impact of commercialization of politics in relation to democracy and stringent laws should be made to discourage all those involved.

11.4 Perception of the Electoral Commission

There is misjudgment of the stature of the Electoral Commission officials. Some sections of Ugandans only praise the Commission when they triumph during elections and accuse it of rigging elections when they lose. The issue of perception towards its constitution, however, would require the amendment of the Constitution.

11.5 Creation of Administrative Units

The administrative units created shortly before the cut-off date to general elections affected the re-organisation of polling station exercise which had long been concluded. Some of the polling stations had to be re-organised to accommodate the new creations, yet when not made in time disenfranchises voters.

11.6 Voters' Cards

The Commission's policy was not to issue voters' cards during the general elections but utilize the photo bearing register. This move was misunderstood and criticized by some section of the public. However, the Electoral Commission reassured the nation that as long as one's voter's particulars were on the register, that would be adequate identity. **This problem will be solved by the National Identity Card project that has been introduced by the Government.**

11.7 Staff Turn-Over

This was experienced during the period under review, wherein the Commission lost senior and experienced staff to greener pastures. This remains a challenge until remunerations are brought in line with the rest of the other organizations.

CHAPTER TWELVE

CONCLUSION AND RECOMMENDATIONS

12.1 CONCLUSION

The Electoral Commission was able to successfully conduct the 2010/2011 General Elections within the constitutional time frame; and the Observers reported that the election results reflected the will of the people of Uganda.

The Commission was adequately funded and was able to procure all the equipment, vehicles and materials required for the conduct of the general elections and therefore, the electoral activities were executed in accordance with the Strategic Plan and Roadmap.

The Commission put in place mechanisms to ensure that the elections were conducted under a conducive environment. These included regular interactions with stakeholders, online access to the national voters' register, use of short messaging services (sms) to locate voting stations and use of the election results transmission and dissemination systems.

The Commission was able to have in place an elected President (1); an elected Parliament (375 MPs); elected 112 District/City Chairpersons and their Councillors (2,817); elected 27 Municipality/City Division Chairpersons and their Councilors(3,586);elected 1,327 Sub-county/Town/Municipal Division Chairpersons and their Councillors (20,524); filled all Youth Council/Committees countrywide (595,710). The figure for Parliament and Local Government Councils include the Representatives of Special Interest Groups (SIGs).

12.2 RECOMMENDATIONS

The Commission recommends the following for future elections:

- Timely enactment and amendment of electoral laws to enable the Commission have enough time to study and interpret them; and formulate voter education messages for dissemination. A twelve (12) month period before a General Elections is proposed for all enactments/amendments;
- Exempting election funds from the requirements of Medium Term Expenditure Framework and phasing the release of funds as it is done for other projects;
- Provision of funds to build a suitable office facility for the Electoral Commission Headquarters;
- Facilitation for continuous voter education and training;
- Retention, strengthening, and facilitation of the Political Crimes Management Department of the Uganda Police;
- Amendment of the law requiring the Returning Officer to submit an election report within seven (07) days to a more realistic period of time considering that these are three (03) levels of elections; and given the constitutional timeline;
- Expeditious issuance of the national identity card for proper identification of Ugandan voters for future elections;
- Sustainability in maintaining the voters' register on the website, and if possible display the register after cleaning. Short message services by mobile phone users wishing to check their particulars on the voters' register and the use of Information Communication Technology should be accorded priority and accordingly funded appropriately.
- Government to enact stringent anti commercialization of election laws/legislation.
